ABOUT THE INTERNATIONAL MOOT COURT COMPETITION



The first-ever International Moot Court Competition of KPMSOL was held on the theme of 'Data Privacy' in 2019. The second international competition was held on the theme of "International Environment Law" on a virtual platform in August 2020. The third edition was conducted on the theme of "International Investment v. National Security" and was concluded successfully in August 2021.

The previous edition saw a participation of over 200+ students from across the world with pertinent teams from international institutions being a part of the competition which included NUS Singapore, Manchester University, APIIT, Sri Lanka and others.

We were honored with the presence of over 60 esteemed legal luminaries from the Supreme Court, various high courts and prestigious law firms across the country including Cyril Amarchand Mangaldas, Shardul Amarchand Mangaldas, Khaitan & Co., AZB Partners, Economic Laws Practices as well as international professionals chairing the bench.

Following the success of the previous editions, we take immense pride in announcing that the 4th International Moot Court Competition is scheduled to be held in August, 2022. Owing to the pandemic situation and keeping in mind the participation of international teams the event will be conducted in Hybrid Mode this year on the theme of "International Crimes", and the proposition for this edition is being drafted by Mr. Ankoosh Mehta, Partner, Cyril Amarchand Mangaldas.

ABOUT THE THEME: 'INTERNATIONAL CRIMES'



International crimes include the most serious crimes that are a matter of global concern. The four main categories are primarily genocide, crimes against humanity, war crimes, and the crime of aggression. Since these crimes affect a considerably large number of people, it becomes crucial to have laws that may help regulate situations like war and also punish those responsible for mass death and destruction. Humanitarian law also referred to as the laws of armed conflict specifically deal with and regulate the conduct of war. War crimes may include heinous offences like killing civilians, killing prisoners of war, wartime sexual violence, committing genocide and others. Since the aforesaid offences are a serious concern globally, it becomes important to understand the intricacies.

With this background in place, the moot proposition for the 4th International Moot Court Competition delves into the intricacies of international humanitarian law in an endeavour to unravel the underlying controversies and complexities. With the involvement of sovereign states and their independent goals and aspirations, the applicability of the principles of international humanitarian law does not come with a straight jacket formula. The proposition thereby attempts to provide to the participants an exhilarating scenario to explore on the contours of international crimes and thereby arrive at an settlement in conformation with the applicable laws and standards.

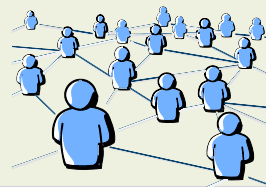

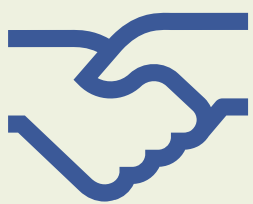
