Parley 2.0 National Debate Competition, 2022

Parley 2.0" National Debate Competition was organized on 30th & 31st May 2022 continuing the legacy started in 2021 with Parley National Debate Competition. Parley 2.0 received participations from across the length and breadth of the country. More than 85 teams (170 participants) from all the prominent law institutes of the country such as RGSOIPL (Law School), IIT Kharagpur, ICFAI University Dehradun, Dr. Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law University Lucknow, Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University Visakhapatnam, Symbiosis Law School, Christ Academy Institute of Law, NMIMS Hyderabad and many more participated in the debate competition.

Parley National Debate Competition, 2021

Parley National Debate Competition 2021 held on 6th February, 2021 received a phenomenal level of response as 40 teams (80 participants) from all over India participated in the competition. Students from educational institutions participated in the event like National Law University Assam, Aurangabad, Bhopal and Ranchi, Symbiosis Law School, Noida, School of Law, Christ (Deemed to be University), Narsee Monjee Institute of Management Sciences, VIT Chennai, K. L. E College of Law, Kalamboli, Navi Mumbai, University of Petroleum and Energy Studies, Dehradun, JECRC University, Banasthali Vidyapeeth, The ICFAI University, Jaipur, Vidyasthali Law College, Shri Bhawani Niketan Vidhi Mahavidyalaya, Mody University of Science and Technology (School of Law), Maharshi Dayanand Law College, University Five Year Law College, Rajasthan University Amity University, Jaipur, Indraprastha Law College participated in the event.

RULES OF THE COMPETITION

ELIGIBILITY & TEAM COMPOSITION

- Members of the team must be valid Undergraduate students pursuing a recognized Bachelor of Law program. (Note – Bachelor of Law means a 3 year or 5 years integrated course in Law recognized by the Bar Council of India).
- The team comprises of two participants.
 - Students from same College / University can participate as a team.
 - Students from different College / University can participate as a team.
- **Only 3 teams per institute / college / university are allowed to participate. (Selection on first come first basis)**

TOPICS

Preliminary (Round 1)– Legality of Internet Shutdown

Semi-Final (Round 2)– Future of Artificial Intelligence

Final (Round 3)– Existence of Human Rights for Victim and Accused

ROUNDS

There are three rounds in the competition i.e., Preliminary, Semi-Final and Final

Preliminary Round :

- i. Competition will be conducted online through virtual rooms. Number of rooms depend on the number of entries received by the college for the competition.
- ii. Proportionally equal number of participants will qualify for semi-final round from each virtual room.
- iii. Each team shall consist of two speakers, one speaking for the motion and one against the motion which will be decided by the participants themselves.
- iv. Each Candidate will be allotted 3+1 minutes in Preliminary Round.
- v. There shall be no rebuttal in this round.

Semi-Final Round :

- i. Selection for semi-final round will be on individual basis. It is not necessary that the entire team will qualify for this round.
- ii. Only 16 participants will be selected for this round.
- iii. The motion for semi-final round will be given by the organizers to the participants after the declaration of result of preliminary round.
- iv. Each Candidate will be allowed 3+1 minutes in Semi-Final Round.
- v. The motion would be decided by draw of lots.
- vi. There would be no rebuttal in this round.

Note: Be prepared for both the motions in advance.

Final Round :

- i. Top 6 participants will qualify for final round.
- ii. The motion would be given by the organizers after the declaration of results of semi-final round.
- iii. Each Candidate will be allowed 5+1 minutes in Final Round.
- iv. The motion would be decided by draw of lots.
- v. There would be rebuttal in this round.

Note: Be prepared for both the motions in advance.

REGISTRATION

Kindly complete and submit the registration form not later than 30th May 2023.

- The Composition of the team cannot be changed once a team has registered.
- Upon successful submission of Registration form, the teams will receive an email from the Organizers, providing them with their Team Code and informing them of their successful Registration.
- If teams do not receive such an email, they may contemporaneously send an email with its registration details to sociolegalrslw@gmail.com or directly contact the members of the organizing committee.
- The registration fee is non-transferable and non-refundable.

LANGUAGE

- The medium of communication will be English only

DRESS CODE

- The dress code for the competition is western or Indian formals. Participants must adhere to the same.

GENERAL RULES

- The Speakers shall not disclose their identities and shall only represent themselves by the Team Codes allotted to them. Team codes shall be provided to each team after successful registration.
- The competition shall consist of 3 rounds i.e., Preliminary, Semi-Final & Final.
- No paper reading is allowed.
- It is mandatory to keep your college ID cards with you at the time of debate competition.
- Use of foul or obscene language will lead to disqualification.
- Participants are allowed to use any source of information during preparatory period of time. No book, document or electronic gadget will be allowed to be used by the participant during the competition.
- Decision made by the panel of Judges will be final and binding.
- Rajasthan School of Law for Women saves the right to alter or change the rules or procedures of the competition.
- The organizers shall not be responsible for any loss due to slow or non-functional internet connection during the competition.
- If a team believes that violation of any of the Competition Rules has taken place at any stage of the Competition, the teams shall within half an hour of the completion of the round wherein a violation has allegedly occurred, register a complaint with Organizing Committee. Under no circumstances are the teams allowed to approach the Judges with any complaints.

Disclaimer : The Rule shall be strictly adhered to. The organizers reserve the right to disqualify teams for deviating from the rules. The Organizers will resolve any contingencies that may arise and will be the final arbiters regarding any doubts/grievances. The decision taken by the Organizers shall be final. These Rules are not exhaustive.

CONDUCTING ROUNDS VIRTUALLY THROUGH VIDEO CONFERENCING

- All the rounds for the competition shall be conducted virtually. The videoconferencing platform would be informed well in time through email.
- The Link of Meeting ID and schedule will be informed to the teams through email.
- All the participants shall keep their microphone on mute at all times, except when addressing arguments. Speaker will unmute his/her microphone only after being invited to do so by the moderator and Judges.
- The speaker must keep their camera on while presenting the argument.
- The participants shall report at least 15 minutes before their scheduled time.

CRITERIA FOR EVALUATION

1. The ground for evaluation of debate will be on following parameters:-
 - Organization and Clarity
 - Presentation Style
 - Knowledge of Subject
 - Originality and Ingeniousness
 - Ability to deal with question and rebuttals concisely and effectively.
