MOOT PROPOSITION

BACKGROUND

The country, Democratic Socialist Republic of Denudia (DSRD) is one belonging to the global south, and whereas, since its independence from foreign rule a few decades ago, has seen progress in leaps and bounds, it is still in the throes of poverty, malnutrition, unequal distribution of wealth, class divides and sectarian strife.

As a developing country, with a majority agrarian economy, the practice of growing crops and rearing animals for various products involves over 50% of the population. As a cluster of small states of varied history and culture, farming in Denudia is a product of various techniques.

Similar to any other country in contemporary times, Denudia faces great harm from accelerating climate change, illustrated by the severe weather events and disruptions in expected weather patterns that have troubled the country increasingly over the last decade.

THE DISPUTE

Dehaya, a state constituent of DSRD has in the exercise of its law-making powers under Entry 6, List II of the Denudian Constitution, declared a certain method of readying farmlands for the next crop sowing, illegal, i.e., the stubble burning method. If any person is found violating this law, and undertaking stubble

burning, they shall be liable to pay a Fine of Rs. 50,000 (Fifty Thousand Rupees), in default whereof, the person found guilty shall be sentenced to imprisonment, simple in nature, for upto 6 months (See Annexure).

The neighboring State of Pundideep, which shares its borders with Dehaya for over 220 kms, is a state where farming is overwhelmingly the occupation of the people, where stubble burning is a common method employed in farming. Invoking the Original Jurisdiction of the Supreme Court of Denudia under Article 131 of its Constitution, the State of Dehaya has filed an original suit against the State of Pundideep for the impact of its farming practices on the health and well-being of the people of Dehaya - State of Dehaya v. State of Pundideep (O.S. No. 35/2023).

On another front, a large number of young persons within the State of Dehaya have been diagnosed with various lung ailments due to continued breathing in of heavy smoke-filled air. Α commissioned by Dehaya shows the major causes of pollution as follows- a. Pollution Industrial 35%. Vehicular Pollution- 13%, Agricultural Pollution-18%, Improper Waste Disposal- 19%, Miscellaneous Causes-15%. Emissions arising from Agriculture have been found to have grown 6 times over the last two months and this is, with some variation, a yearly occurrence. A recent study by a

world-renowned university suggested that the residents of Dehaya and certain parts of Pundideep were expected to lose almost 12 years of life expectancy due to consistent exposure to high levels pollution. Pursuant to this, association claiming to work for the youth of the country, termed as Dehaya Youth for Climate Justice (DYCJ) have filed a writ petition against the State of Pundideep in the Supreme Court under Article 32, for their compromised health, stating that the yearly increase in the smoke content of the air is directly conditions' related their health to deterioration - Dehaya Youth for Climate Justice v. State of Pundideep (W.P. No. 2345/2023).

The states of Dehaya and Pundideep, while formerly a part of the State of Ninjaya, were made into two separate States by a central law to that effect from January 1, 1998. As a large agrarian State, but with slow development, traditional farming methods prevailed in the State. As a result, numerous farmers now have lands in both states. In 2016, the State of Dehaya under the Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act issued a gazette notification (2016 Notification) under Section 19, prohibiting stubble burning by traditional method, and the penalty therefor, was 6 months imprisonment. Certain such farmers, having lands across state borders were arrested by the State Police of Dehaya, and are now subject to Trial as per the 2016 Notification. Opposing such trials, Pundideep

Agriculture Cooperative (PAC) has filed a writ petition under Article 32, claiming violation of the right to livelihood - Pundideep Agriculture Cooperative v. State of Dehaya (W.P. No. 3154/2023).

While continuously broadcasting programs aimed at spreading awareness against stubble burning and highlighting its 'prohibited' nurture under law, news channels within the State of Dehaya also suggested that the State of Pundideep, despite being responsible for deteriorating conditions of the people of Dehaya, had chosen a stand reflecting ignorance and were "backwards in science" and "unaware of the massive issue of climate change", for they chose not to enact such a law, in spite of efforts of Dehaya's governmental representative trying to convince them otherwise. News Broadcasting Standards Authority independent (NBSA). body an countrywide journalists and personalities have filed a writ petition against Article 32 of the Constitution against 4 news channels held and controlled by the State of Dehaya for "biased, incorrect showing а vindictive" media campaign maligning the State of Pundideep staging the same to be violative of and offensive to "the standards of journalistic ethics or public taste" - News Broadcasting Standards Authority v. State of Dehaya, represented through its chief secretary, ministry of information and broadcasting and Others (W.P. No. 3728/2023).

State of Dehaya v. State of Pundideep (O.S. No. 35/2023), Dehaya Youth for Climate Justice v. State of Pundideep No. 2345/2023). (W.P. Pundideep Agriculture Cooperative v. State of Dehaya (W.P. No. 3154/2023), News Broadcasting Standards Authority v. State of Dehaya, represented through its Chief Secretary, Ministry of Information and Broadcasting and Others (W.P. 3728/2023), have been listed before the division bench of the Supreme Court for admission on.

ISSUES

The Issues that arise for the consideration of the Court are:

- Whether O.S. No. 35/2023, W.P. No. 2345/2023, W.P. No. 3154/2023, W.P. No. 3728/2023 are maintainable and can be heard together?
- 2. W.P. No. 3154/2023: Whether the action taken by the State of Dehaya in arresting certain persons for engaging in stubble burning is sustainable in law?
- 3. W.P. No. 2345/2023: Whether, as per the established principles of environmental law, the State of Pundideep can be held liable for exacerbating the health issues of the residents of Dehaya?
- 4. W.P. No. 3728/2023: Whether the conduct of the Dehayan News Channels violates the principles enunciated by statutory and regulatory authorities for the regulation of news and media content?

ASSUMPTIONS

- The laws and system of governance of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Denudia are pari materia to that of India.
- 2. No law, in respect to redistribution of large areas of land stands passed. The owners of such land prior to bifurcation and presently, are the same.
- 3. The general penal provision under the Air Act 1981 shall be deemed to be carrying a punishment of 6 months, and the cases, if any, involving the said provision shall be deemed applicable to the instant dispute.
- 4. There is no law, duly enacted by the Parliament of Denudia prohibiting stubble burning

ANNEXURE

The Stubble Burning (Prevention and Prohibition) Act, 2023

An Act to prevent and prohibit the pollution of air caused through stubble burning.

OBJECTS AND REASONS

This law has been enacted keeping in view that climate change and increase in the global population has put a strain on production by farming and in order to maximise such production, methods, environmentally unsustainable have become of rampant usage.

1. Short title and commencement:

(a) This Act may be called the Stubble

Burning (Prevention and Prohibition) Act, 2023.

(b) It shall come into force from the date specified by the Government of Dehaya in its Official Gazette and shall govern the whole territory of Dehaya.

2. Definition

- (a) "Air Pollution" shall mean, release into the atmosphere of various gases, finely divided solids, or finely dispersed liquid aerosols at rates that exceed the natural capacity of the environment to dissipate and dilute or absorb them. These substances may reach concentrations in the air that cause undesirable health, economic, or aesthetic effects.
- (b) "Stubble" shall mean the base of the plant and the straw residue remaining on the surface of the soil following the harvest of particular crops. It shall include material discharged from the harvester and/or the material that is usually burned after the harvest to clear the land for next agricultural season.
- (c) "Stubble burning" shall mean one of several types of 'prescribed biomass burning' or traditional methods of burning the stubble which includes burning them by fire, which will or is likely to result in Air Pollution.
- **3.Prevention of Stubble Burning:** The authorities of the state shall be responsible for carrying out programs, comprehensive in nature, in order to educate and spread awareness among

the general public, including the farmers, and any other persons who may be engaged in the practise of stubble burning, against the environmentally negative consequences of such an act.

4.Prohibition of Stubble Burning: Any person, found to be wilfully, knowing, and intentionally engaging in the prohibited practise of Stubble burning shall be liable to pay fine of Rs. 50,000 for each infraction, and for each subsequent violation of this provision, the offender shall be liable to pay Rs. 1,00,000 per instance of Stubble burning. If a person fails to pay such fine, such person shall be liable to undergo an imprisonment of upto 6 months.

5. Application of other laws not barred:

The provisions of this Act shall be in addition to, and not in derogation of any other law for the time being in force, unless such law is inconsistent with any of the provisions contained herein.
